

1. How to study in New Zealand

Here's a step-by-step guide on how to study in New Zealand as an International Student:

1. Eligibility:

- Assess if you meet entry requirements
- Fix your budget and study course
- Check tuition fees

2. Study Programme

- Choose your study programme
- Choose an approved education provider
- Check scholarships

3. Apply

- Gather required documents
- Submit application
- Receive an offer of place
- Accept it
- Get the English language test report

4. Student Visa

- Prepare visa documents
- Arrange funds
- Get your Medicals & PCC(Police Clearance Certificate)
- Lodge your Student Visa
- Receive an AIP (approval in principle)
- Pay Tuition fees & Living Expenses
- eVisa issued

2. How to apply for your programme

The checklist below will help you understand everything you need to know about the process.

1. Application Form

- Complete all a sections
- Fill all mandatory fields

2. Verified Documents*

- High School Transcripts (Grade 10 & 12)
- High School Pass Certificates (Grade 10 & 12)
- Passport first page (that has your photo and signature)
- Passport last page (That indicates your address)
- Updated CV/Resume
- English Language Test Results (if appeared)
- Work Experience Offer Letter / Experience letters (If applicable)
- Statement of Purpose (if applicable)

Additional Documents for Post-graduate courses:

- Bachelor's Degree Completion Certificate
- Bachelor's Degree all semesters mark sheets
- Bachelor's Degree transcripts & consolidated transcript
- Post Graduation Degree Completion Certificate (If applicable)
- Post Graduate Degree all semesters mark sheets (If applicable)
- Post Graduate transcripts & consolidated mark sheets

3. Read the terms and conditions

4. Submit your application form

5. The education provider will get in touch to let you know the next steps in the admissions process

To be accepted, the verification must include:

- *The statement "I certify that the attached is a true copy of the original document."*
- *Initials and full name*
- *Title*
- *Registration number (if applicable)*
- *Location*
- *Signature*
- *Date*
- *Signature*

#If your documents are in a language other than English, you must provide an English translation for each document. The translations must be prepared and certified by an acceptable translation service.

3. How to apply for your Student Visa

You'll need a Fee Paying Student Visa if you're coming to New Zealand to study for more than three months. Your Student Visa is normally for the same length of time as the study you've paid for. Depending on your visa conditions, you may be able to work up to 20 hours a week during the term and full-time over the holidays. The usual timeframe for visa processing is 46 days.

Here are the steps to help you with preparing your application:-

1. Gather your documents:

- Identity: Current and previous Passports, 1-2 acceptable photos
- Health: Medical Certificate, Chest X-ray (certain cases)
- Character: Police Clearance Certificate

- Academics: School and college certificates
- Offer of Place or confirmation of enrolment
- Funds: Bank statements, Sponsorship evidence (if any), Loan approval letter (if any)
- Cover letter or statement of purpose explaining your purpose of travel
- Copy of each page of your passports indicating travels
- Letter(s) of the previous visa declines (any/all countries)
- Evidence of your work and employment history

2. Submit your application:

- Set up an account on the Immigration New Zealand official portal
- Submit visa application with supporting documents
- Pay visa and related immigration fees

3. Visa Decision:

- Assessment of visa application
- Immigration Officer may ask for additional information or interview
- Receive an AIP (approval in principal)
- Pay Tuition fees & Living Expenses (within 10 working days)
- Proof of Medical and Travel Insurance
- Travel ticket or proof that you've money to buy one
- Receipt of tuition fees paid
- eVisa issued
